**Olmec mysteries:** Extremes in art often have an arresting affect, regardless of their cultural origin or the intended meanings behind them. We know almost nothing about the ancient Olmec people, who inhabited southern Mexico, but this stunning exhibition proves that their artisans could work stone to equal effect at the scale of monumental heads or the intimate scale of figurines and inscribed plaques.
