

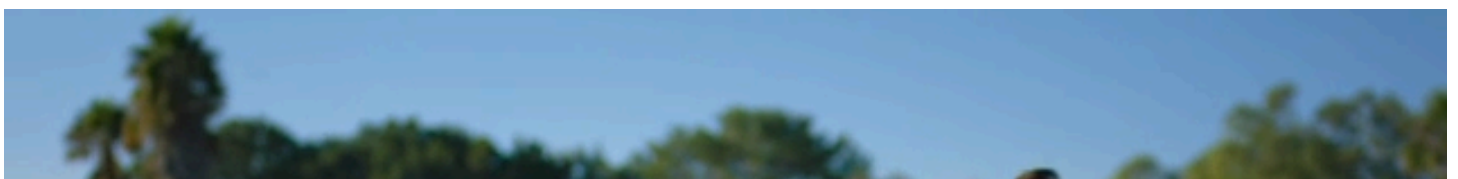
3 art shows to check out, Jan. 29-Feb. 1
